SUPERVISOR: Kelly Smith. Supervisor Assistant: Jennifer Strickland. The Supervisor has responsibility for preparation of the township budget, oversight of township properties, and recommending appointments for various boards and commissions. He serves as the Human Resources Director, the Chief Assessing Officer, and the Purchasing Agent for the Township.

TREASURER: Sarah Iteen. Deputy Treasurer: Diana Boulton. The Treasurer is responsible for tax collection and disbursement, investment of township funds, and check issuance. The Treasurer handles bond issues for the township, and also serves as the Water and Sewer Administrator. The Treasurer sends out tax bills twice per year: July 1 (due by September 14), and December 1 (due by February 14). Taxes may be paid to the Treasurer by mail, in person, or online. A drop box is available for after-hours convenience. Postmark dates are not accepted.

CLERK: Rachelle Enbody. Deputy Clerk: Kara Jehl. The Clerk has responsibility for maintaining township records, and voter registration files. The Clerk conducts elections, posts meeting notices, and prepares financial statements. She also serves as the Benefits Plan Administrator and the Grants Administrator. Absentee ballots are available at the Clerk's Office. Pere Marquette Township has two election precincts: precinct 1 residents vote at the Township Hall (lower level), and precinct 2 residents vote at Calvary Baptist Church at 220 N. Jebavy Drive.

ASSESSOR: Derek Eaton. Contact the Assessor's Office for information on assessments, property descriptions, principal residence (homestead) exemptions and related matters, and to process a name or address change on Township records.

BUILDING AND ZONING ADMINISTRATION:

Building Official: Thomas Fulker. **Zoning Administrator and Code Enforcement Officer:** Kristin Lange. Permits are necessary for most types of construction and demolition within the Township. Some situations may require a zoning permit. The Township operates under the Michigan Building Code and the Michigan Residential Code.

WATER AND SEWER DEPARTMENT: Maintenance, testing and meter installation is handled by the water and sewer department. Administrative Assistant: Leanne Chaltron. Meters are read quarterly at the end of March, June, September and December. Utility bills are issued by the Treasurer's department. Utility bills may be paid by mail, in person, or online. Automatic debits may be arranged through the Treasurer's Office.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: Chief: Scott Graczyk. The Pere Marquette Fire Department currently has approximately 20 volunteer firefighters. The unit headquarters are at 1040 S. Pere Marquette Highway. DIAL 911 for emergencies. <u>NOTE</u>: Help the dispatcher by telling her/him that the destination address is in Pere Marquette Township. Non-emergency phone – (231) 843-0324 (leave message) and Fire Chief's cell phone: 231.852.9669.

HALL RENTAL and PARKS: <u>HALL RENTAL:</u> The lower level rental hall is available for rent to non-residents and residents, alike. Amenities include a full kitchen, tables, chairs, and A/C. The hall has a 139-person capacity.

<u>PARKS</u>: Pere Marquette Township operates four parks: Memorial Tree Park on N. Washington and Ivanhoe; Buttersville Park on S. Lakeshore Drive; Conservation Park on S. Lakeshore Dr.; Suttons Landing near the corner of Iris Rd. and S. Pere Marquette Hwy. on the Pere Marquette River. There is a "no hunting" ban in all of the Township parks. For information on any of the parks, check the website or contact the Parks Department, (231) 845-1277, ext. 236.

WASTE REMOVAL SERVICES: Residential collection is contracted through Republic Services of Manistee. At this time, the Township does not provide waste collection services for businesses. Please visit our website for more information concerning acceptable and non-acceptable recycling and bulk items at www.pmtwp.org or call **Republic at (231) 723-4850 (Manistee Office)**.



Waste removal in Pere Marquette Township is done on:

- Monday for regular trash
- > Tuesday for yard waste container
- > Second Monday of the month for recycling
- > First Monday of the month for Bulk Items

If either day falls on a Federal Holiday pick up will be on the following day.

Republic Services observes the following major holidays: New Year's Eve, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

Bulk Items	Two (2) bulky items or up to 10 bags per residential home picked up the 1 st Monday of each month. <i>Items with Freon must have a purchase tag.</i> Please call (231) 723-4850 if additional man power is required to lift item.
Christmas Tree	Curbside during January

LEAF REMOVAL: Curbside leaf collection is provided by the Township at no additional cost to residents. Leaves are collected in the spring for a short period, time will be determined by weather; and October 31 until the snow flies. Leaf piles should be placed at the roadside but not in the roadway. Piles must be free of sticks, grass clippings, and other debris.

BRUSH REMOVAL: Brush service is provided by the Township at no additional cost to residents. Brush should be neatly stacked along the roadside, Notify the township office when the brush is ready and the brush will be removed in a timely manner. This service is intended for routine yard maintenance. Major projects, such as tree removal or lot clearing require special permission and additional fees. Please call the township office before putting brush out if you have a large amount.

Residential Services

Pere Marquette Township provides several services to residents to assist them with their yard and lawn maintenance tasks. These services are offered on an annual basis.

- Leaf Removal is offered by the Pere Marquette Department of Public Works as an optional service to residents. This is a no charge service. The DPW will pick up leaves at curbside during a few weeks in the spring, and throughout the fall season. Leaves should be placed in a row along the roadside (but not in the roadway). They should not be mixed with other yard debris, such as twigs and grass clippings, which make it difficult for the leaf vacuum to remove the leaves. The timing of these pickups depends largely on weather. Please check with the township offices for information about specific times as the season draws near.
- **Brush Removal** is offered by the Pere Marquette Department of Public Works as an optional service to residents. This is a no charge service. The DPW will pick up brush at curbside with a grapple truck. Brush should be neatly stacked, but not in the roadway. Notify the township office when you are in need of removal service and the brush will be removed within 10 days of your call. This service is intended for homeowner's routine yard maintenance. Major projects, such as tree removal and lot clearing require special permission and additional fees. Please call the township office before putting brush at curbside if you have a large amount.
- Yard Waste Removal is offered by *Republic Services (231.723.4850)* as an optional service to residents. The cost for this service is **\$65.00** for service April through November (weather permitting). For this cost Republic will provide a 96 gallon yard waste container which they empty at curbside Tuesday mornings. This container holds up to 100 pounds of yard refuse: grass clippings, leaves, brush, etc. Each year a new sticker can be purchased at the town hall which ensures your pickup service for the season.

Pere Marquette Township Bulk Item Pickup Program

Pickup is on your first regular waste collection day of each month.



A single family home is a stand-alone house or residential building (also called a single-detached dwelling, detached residence or separate house) that is occupied by one family. **Bulk items are defined as follows:**

• Two (2) bulk items; or

• Two (2) non-freon household appliances

Note: Any freon appliance, such as a freezer, refrigerator or A/C unit is not allowed without the freon removed or the purchase of a freon disposal tag from the Township.

Instructions

Place bulk items at the curb by 7:00 a.m. or the night prior to your collection day. Each household is allowed to place only two (2) items per month. Please consider donating items that may be used by another family to Help-Ministry, St. Simon's Bargain Center, Habitat for Humanity or Goodwill.

Elections

Elections are handled through the Pere Marquette Charter Township Clerk's office. All precincts are handicap accessible and instruction in alternative formats of audio and Braille are available at all precincts upon request. An accessible voting device is also available.

Absentee Voting:

Applications for absentee ballots are available in the Clerk's office. Regular office hours are 8:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. In addition, the Clerk's office will be open on the Saturday preceding the election from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for the purpose of accepting and processing Absentee Ballot Applications and for issuing Absentee Ballots.

The deadline to request an absentee ballot is before 4:00 p.m. on the Monday preceding the election. Ballots requested on the Monday preceding the election must be requested and voted in person at the Pere Marquette Charter Township Clerk's office at 1699 S. Pere Marquette Hwy., Ludington, Michigan.

If you are a Uniformed Service member, a family member of a Uniformed Service member, or a citizen residing outside the United States, you may register to vote and apply for an absentee ballot at: <u>https://www.fvap.gov/uploads/FVAP/Forms/fpca.pdf</u>

Voter Identification Requirements:

Every Michigan voter who offers to vote at the polls must comply with the requirement by showing picture identification or signing an affidavit attesting that he or she is not in possession of picture identification. (MCL 168.523)

<u>Voters with picture ID</u>: Voters can satisfy the ID requirement by showing a Michigan driver's license or a Michigan personal identification card. Voters who do not possess either document may show any of the following forms of picture ID as long as it is current:

- Driver's license or personal ID card issued by another state
- Federal or state government-issued photo identification
- U.S. passport
- Military identification card with photo
- Student identification card with photo from high school or an accredited institution of higher education
- Tribal identification card with photo

<u>Voters without picture ID</u>: Michigan election law anticipates that not all voters will have picture identification. Voters who do not have acceptable picture ID or forgot to bring acceptable picture ID to the polls, can vote like any other voter by signing an affidavit.

How do I update my address on my voter registration?

If you are a registered Michigan voter, your voter registration information will be updated automatically when you change your address on your Michigan driver's license or ID.

If you are updating your address within two weeks of an election, you must visit your local clerk's office in person if you would like to vote in the election using your new address.

qualifications

To register to vote in Michigan you must be:

- A Michigan resident (at the time you register) and a resident of your city or township for at least 30 days (when you vote).
- A United States citizen.
- At least 18 years of age (when you vote).
- Not currently serving a sentence in jail or prison.

residential & mailing address

You may only register to vote in one place. If you have more than one place of residence, you may register to vote in the place where you are currently located or the place you intend to return. For example, students attending college may register in their hometown or at their campus address, and temporary in-patient residents of nursing homes may register at their home address or at the medical facility.

If you would prefer to receive mail related to your voter registration or driver's license/state identification card at an address other than your residential address (ex. PO Box), you may provide a mailing address where indicated on the form. If you provide a mailing address, it won't appear on your voter information card or driver's license/state identification card.

criminal convictions and registering to vote

If you have a past criminal conviction and are no longer in jail or prison, you **can** register and vote. You also can register and vote if you are in jail and awaiting trial or sentencing. If you are currently serving a sentence in jail or prison you **can't** register or vote.

deliver to your city or township clerk

Mail or deliver this completed application directly to your city or township clerk. Find your city or township clerk's address at Michigan.gov/Vote.

registering by mail - special requirements for first-time voters

Are you registering to vote in Michigan for the first time?

If you have never voted in Michigan and choose to submit this form by mail or through a voter registration drive, you must meet the federal identification requirement as explained below.

federal requirement – provide identification

To comply with the identification requirement, you must:

 Enter your Michigan-issued driver's license number or Michigan-issued state ID card number where requested on this form.

or

- (2) If you do not have a Michigan-issued driver's license or Michigan-issued state ID card, provide the last four digits of your Social Security number.
- (3) Send one of the following forms of identification when mailing this form to your county, city or township clerk: a COPY of a current and valid photo identification (such as a driver's license or state ID card from any state) or a COPY of a paycheck stub, utility bill, bank statement or a government document that lists your name and address.

DO NOT SEND ORIGINAL ID DOCUMENTS BY MAIL

If this requirement applies to you and you don't provide the information identified above, you must provide an acceptable form of identification before you vote in the first election in which you wish to participate.

Note: The identification requirement **doesn't** apply if you: (1) personally hand-deliver this form to your county, city or township clerk's office instead of mailing this form or submitting it through a voter registration drive, (2) are disabled or (3) are eligible to vote under the federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act.

Contact your city or township clerk if you have any questions.

Your application isn't valid until accepted by your city or township clerk. If your application is accepted, your clerk will mail you a voter information card within 3 weeks. You can verify your voter registration status by going to Michigan.gov/Vote.

This form will also change your DL/ ID address. You'll be mailed a sticker with your new address to put on your DL/ID.

If you have never voted in person in Michigan and choose to submit this form by mail or through a voter registration drive, **review the instructions on page 1**. You might need to provide additional ID.
